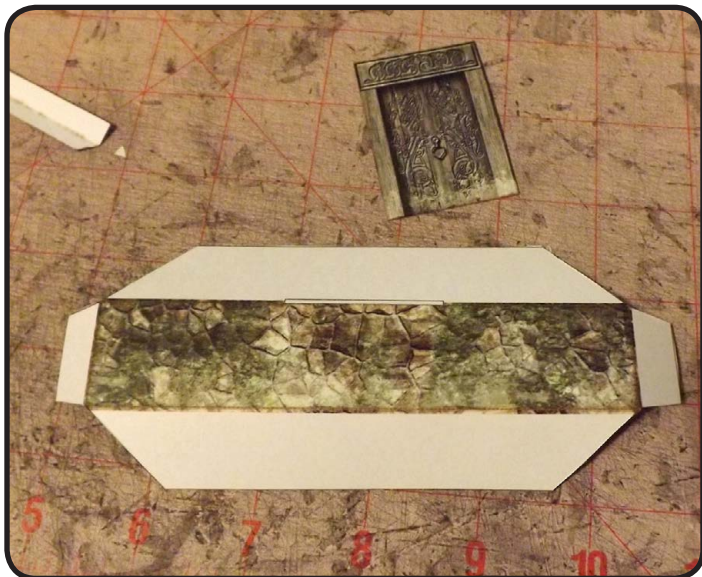


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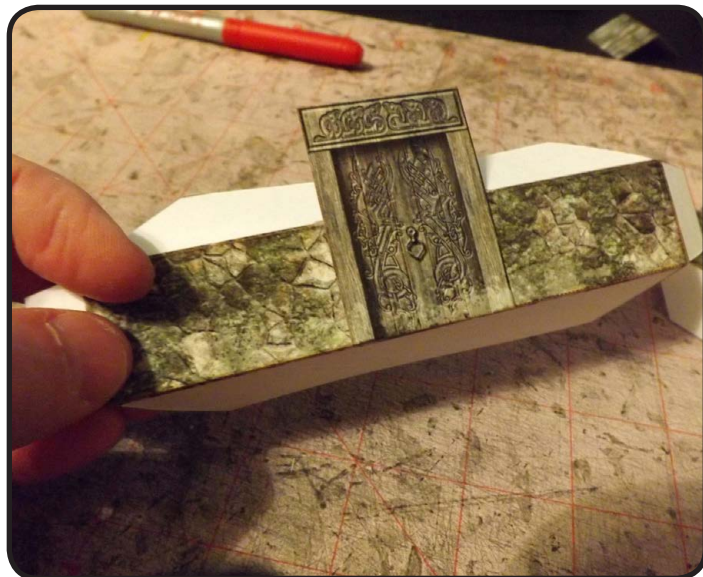
RAVENFELL: VIKING EXPANSION SET

Viking Buildings

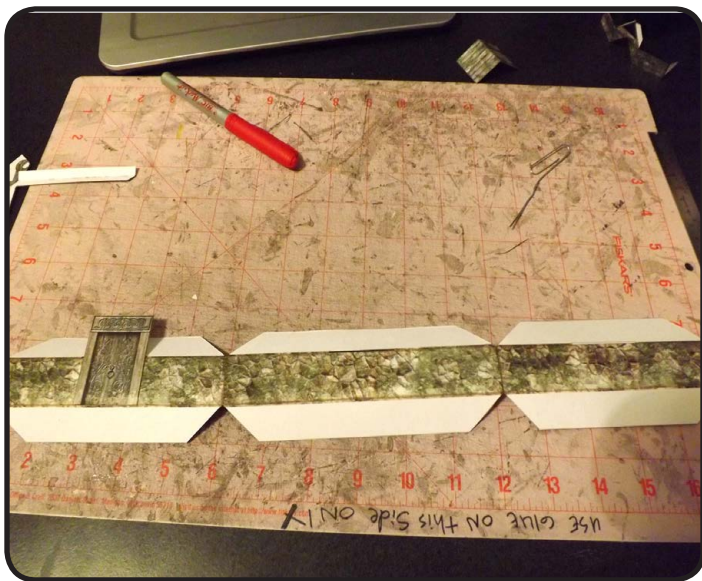
All three Viking buildings build in the same way, so we are showing just one here.



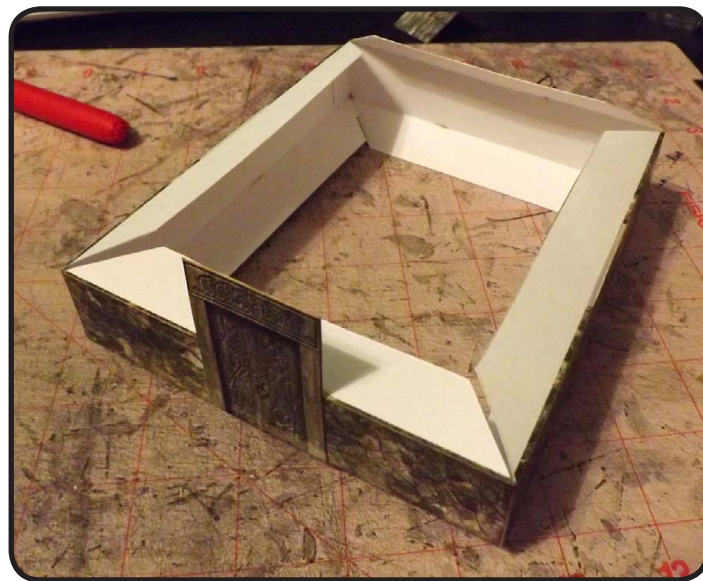
1: Cut out the side walls and select a door (only for Building 'B', Buildings 'A' and 'C' have the doors pre-printed on the wall sides.).



2: Only for Building B, glue the door to the short-width wall in the center.

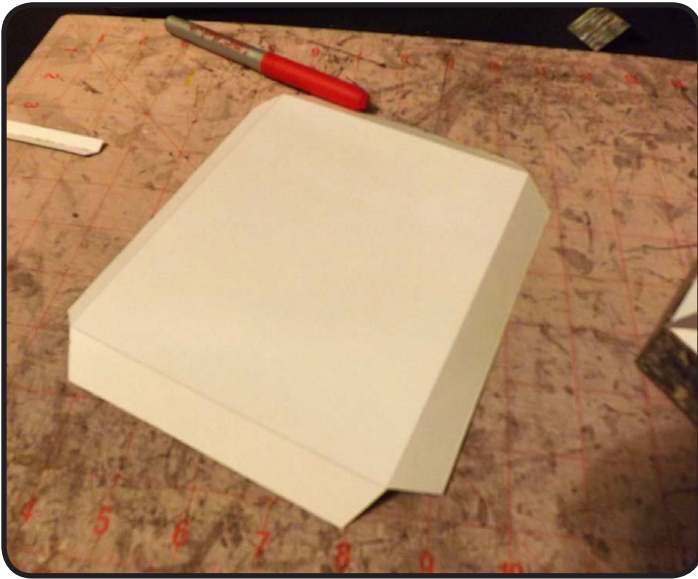


3: Now glue all four wall sections into one long strip.

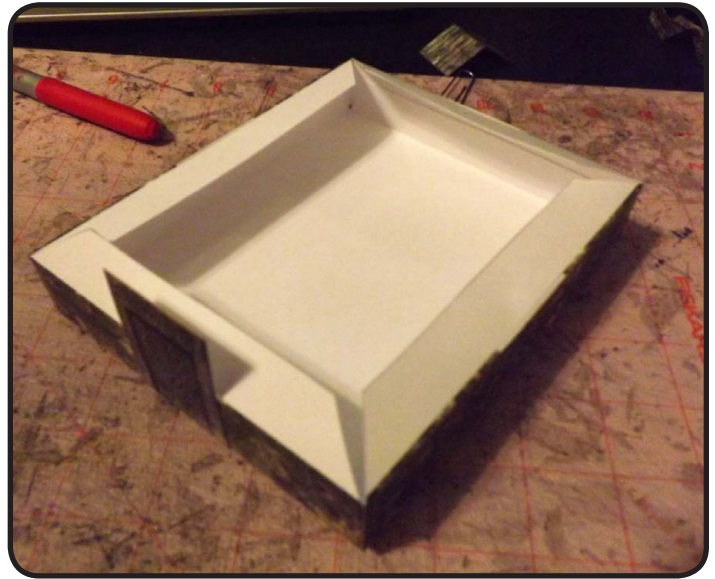


4: Glue the ends together forming a square.

5: Cut out the interior brace.



6: Insert, but do not glue, the brace inside the walls. This will force them to stay in alignment until you wish to fold them flat for storage.

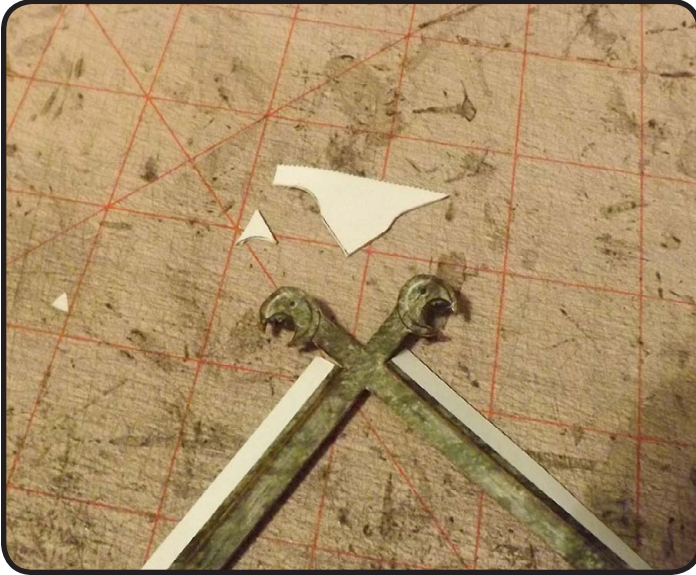


7: Cut and score the roof edges.



8: Fold the top section over and glue.

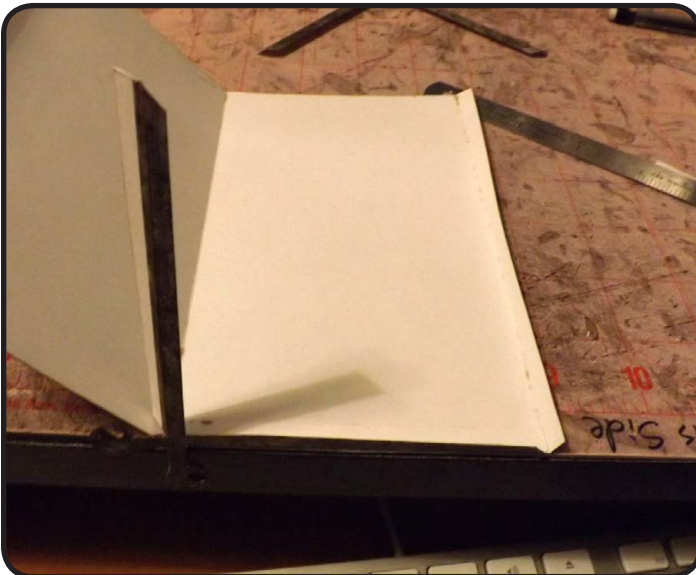

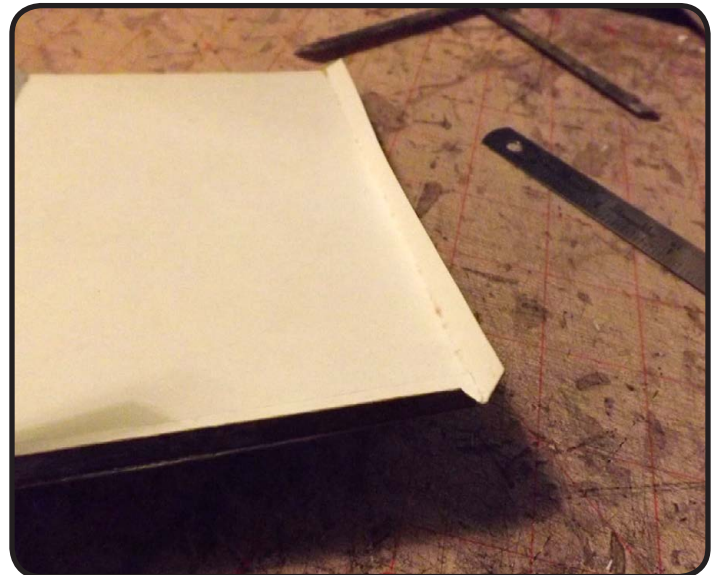
9: Cut away the excess white areas.



10: Cut and score the main roof piece.

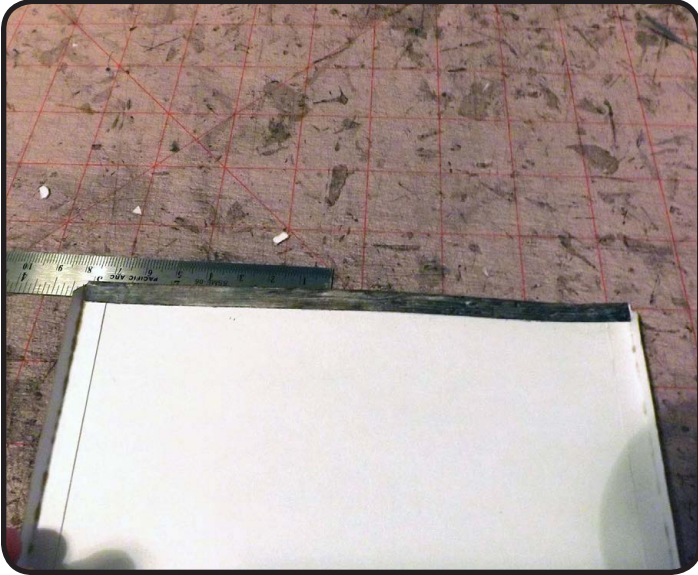


11: Glue the completed roof edges to the underside of the main roof along the front edges. You will need to do this at the edge of a table.



12: The tab should meet the outer roof flap at its crease as shown above.

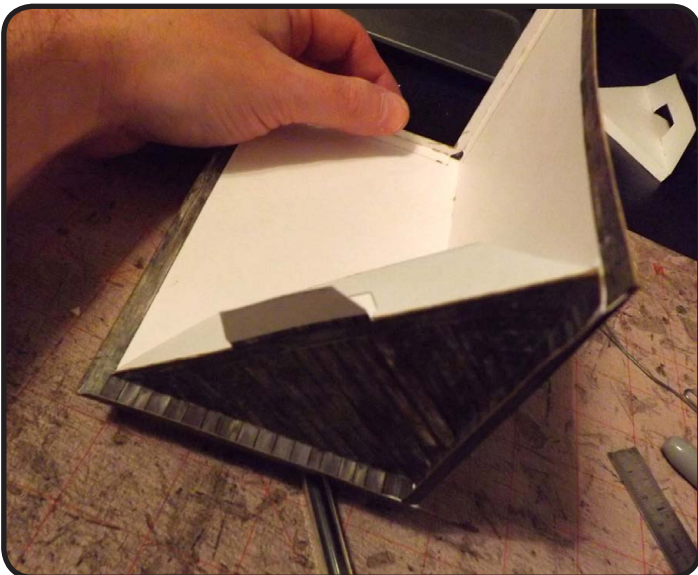

13: Once the front and back edges are dry, fold over the roof side flaps and glue. These will overlap the roof edge glue tabs at their ends.



14: The roof with the ends in place.



15: Glue the roof side walls next.

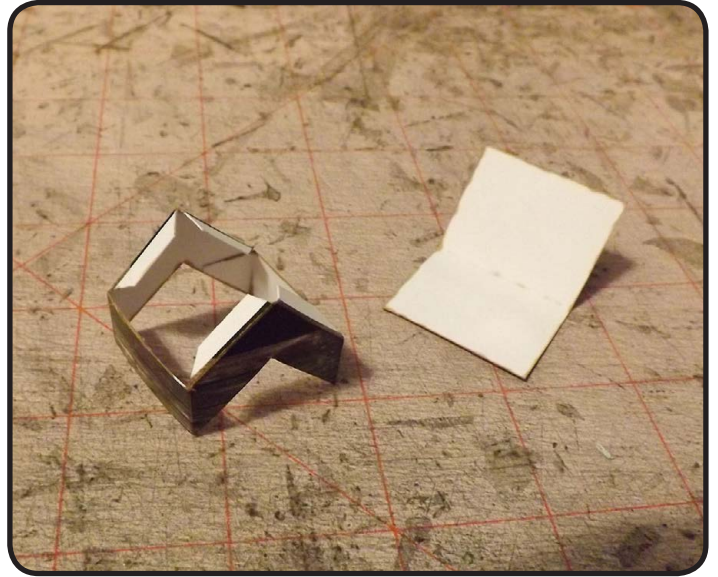


16: The completed roof.

17: The roof attached to the lower side walls.



18: Cut, score, and begin gluing the smoke hole cover as depicted above.



19: Glue the top to the sides as shown.



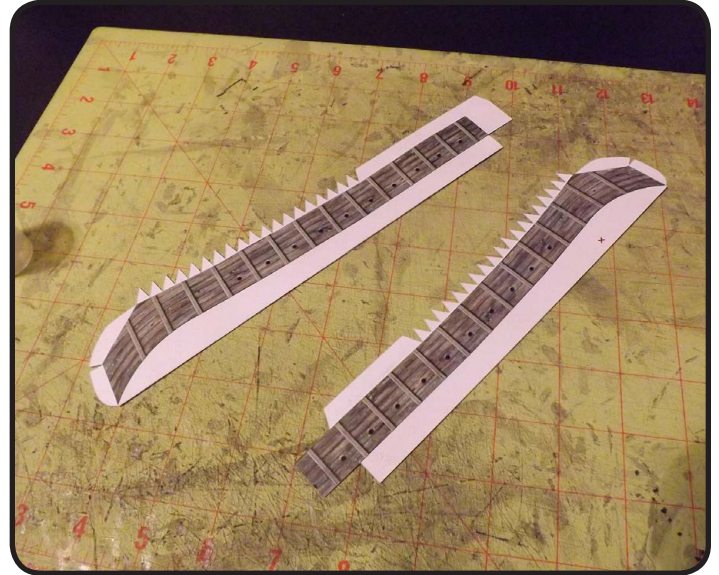
20: Place the completed cover atop the roof during game play.

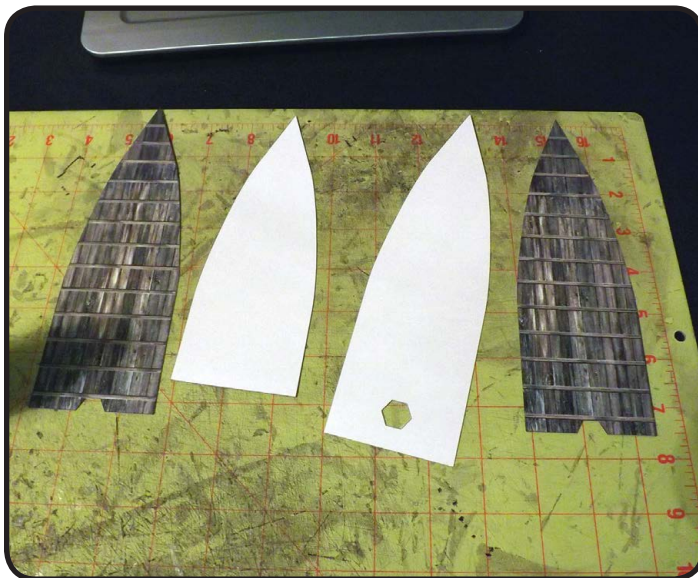
Longboat



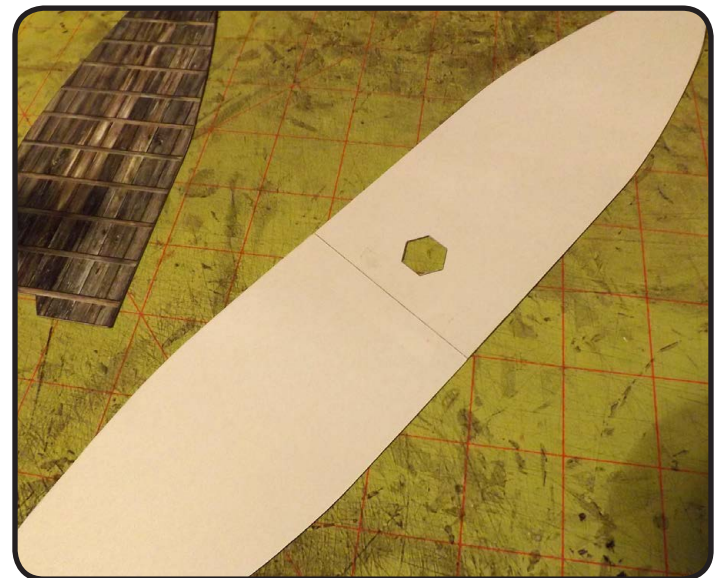
1: Cut and score the four side pieces of the boat.



2: Fold over and glue each section in half and allow to fully dry before proceeding.

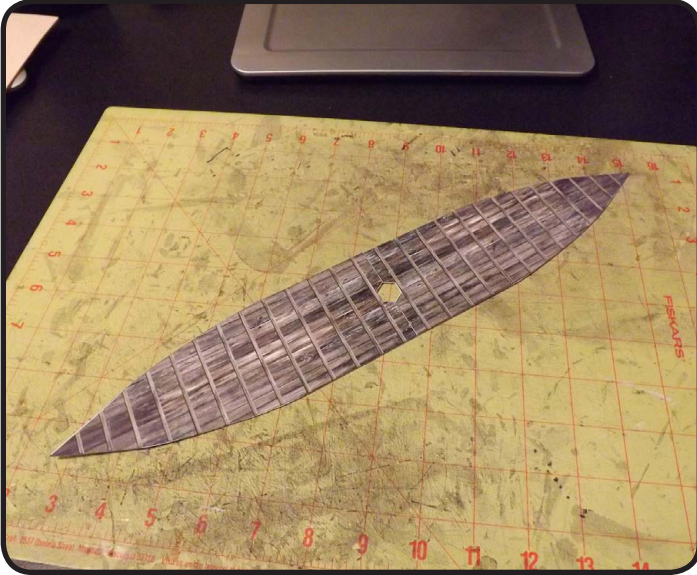


3: Cut out the four deck pieces.

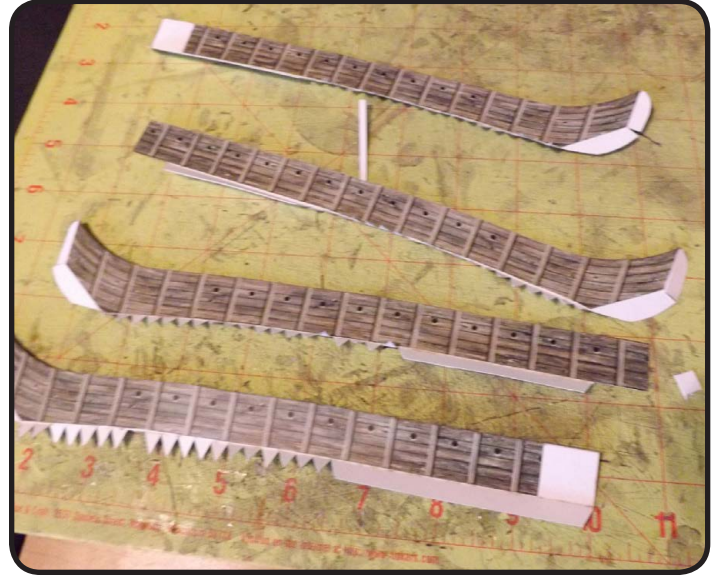


4: Use a small piece of tape to attach the two white pieces together.

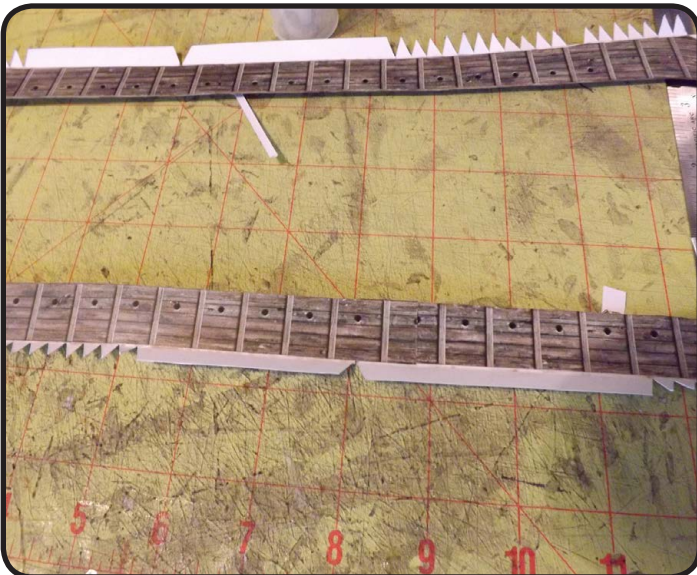

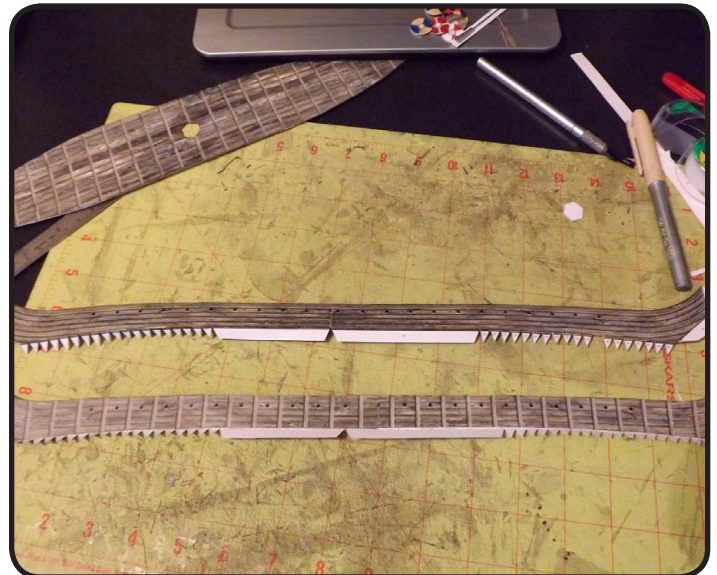
5: Flip the white pieces over and glue the upper deck pieces to them.



6: Cut away the excess white areas for the hull sides as shown above.

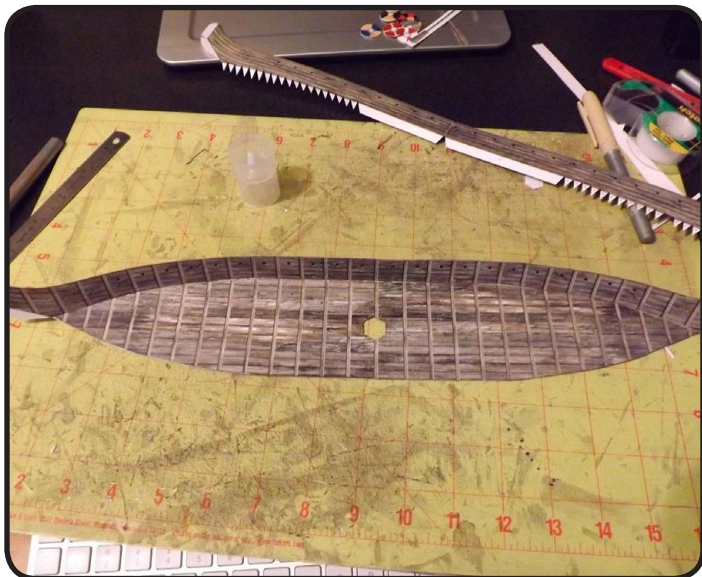


7: Glue the hull sides together, paying attention to the shadow direction for each piece.



8: The finished hull sides.

9: Begin gluing a hull side to the deck starting in the MIDDLE, use the cross beams to aid in alignment, and pay attention to shadow direction. Work slowly towards the ends gluing a few tabs at a time.



10: When you reach the end, glue the forward tabs together (these point forward).

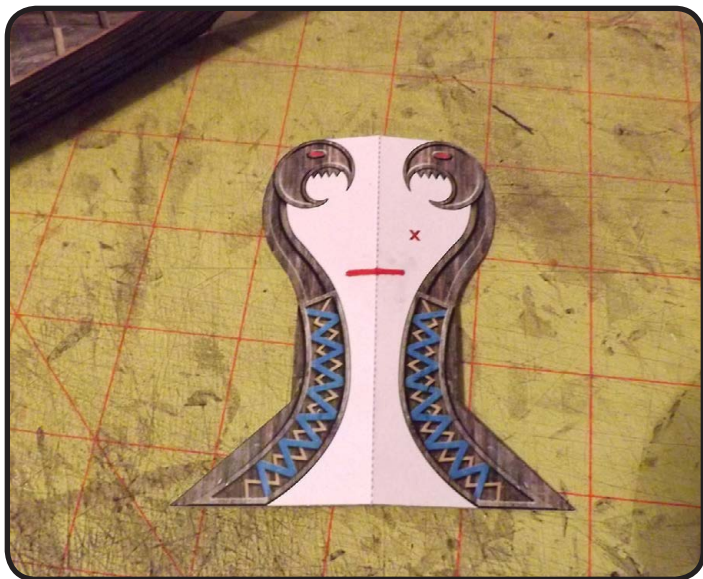


11: A springclip or paperclip is useful if you don't want to hold the end tabs as they dry.



12: Cut and score the boat ends. Leave the white areas shown (for now.)

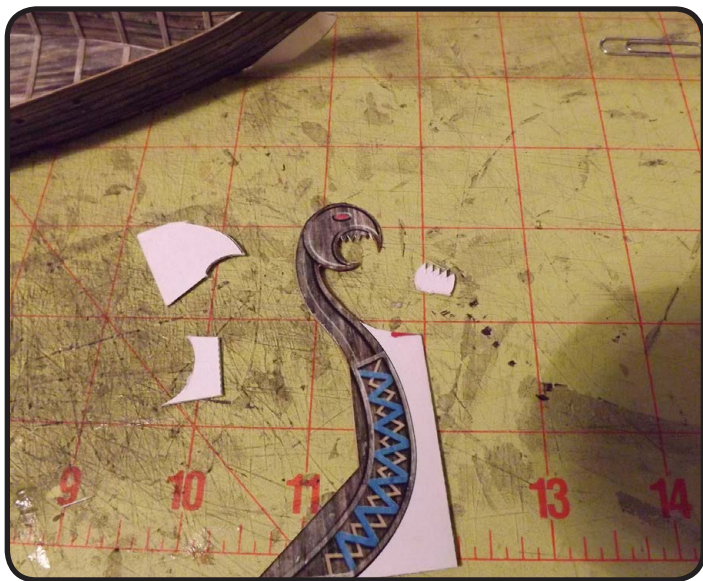

13: Next, you will glue HALF of the end piece together. Apply glue to the back side ABOVE the red line and fold in half.



14: When dry, it should look like this, the top half glued together, while the lower half is still able to be separated.

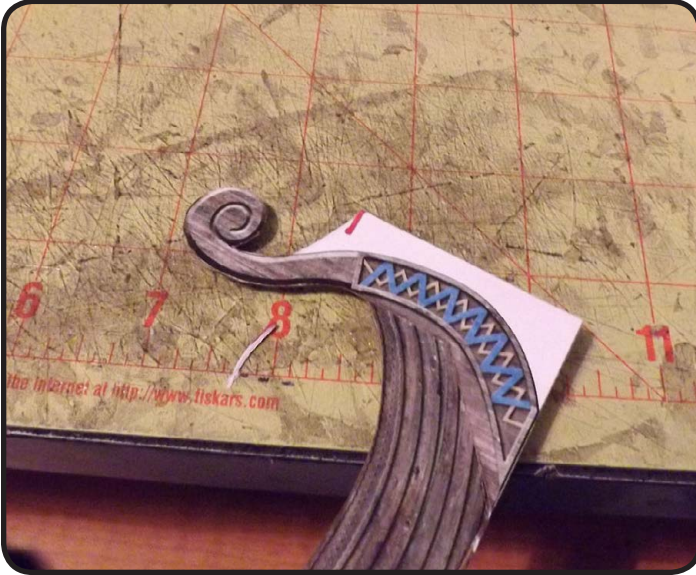


15: Now cut away the excess white areas on the upper half only (where it is already glued together.)



16: Glue the end piece over the front tabs on the boat and allow to dry.

17: Once dry, set on a table edge like this, and carefully cut away the remaining excess white areas.



18: The finished front end. Repeat for the rear end.

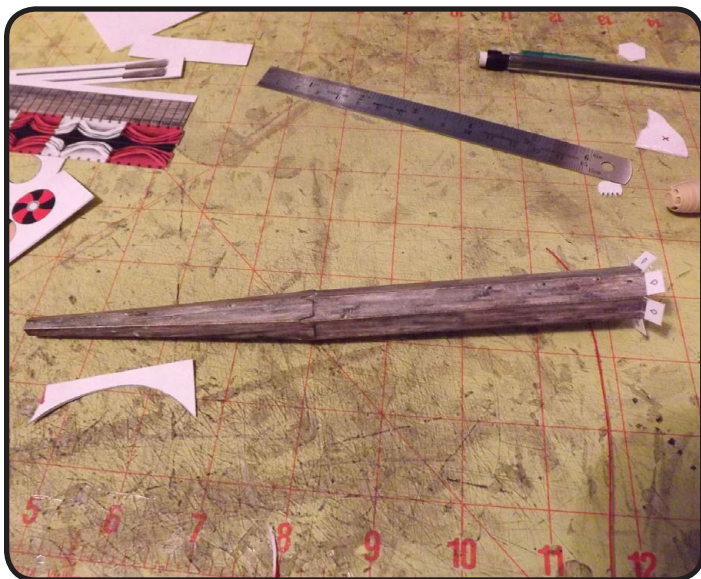


19: Cut and score the two pieces for the mast.



20: Glue into their tube shapes and allow to dry.

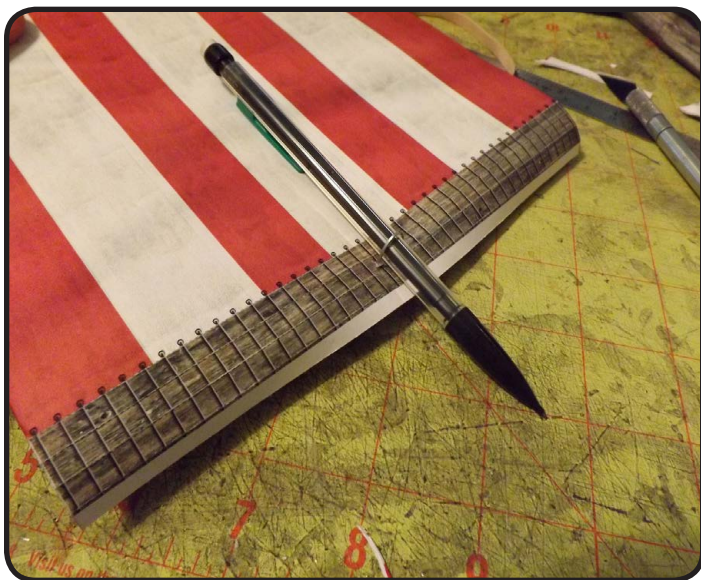

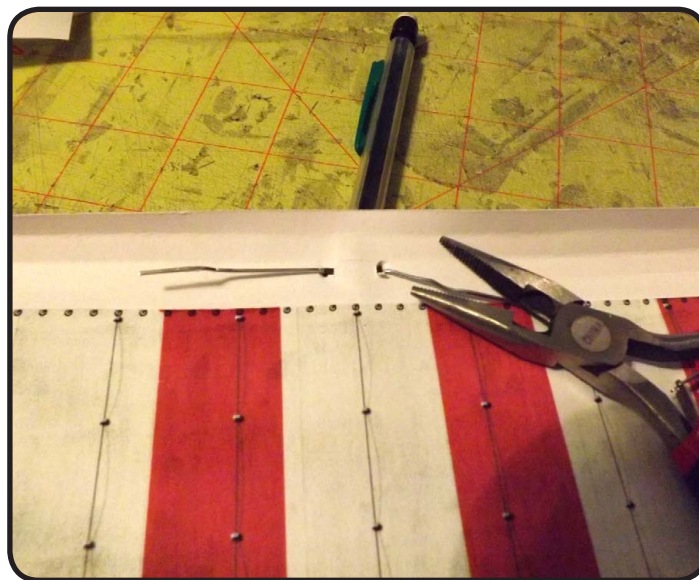
21: Glue the two mast sections together.



22: Glue the two halves of the sail together, aligning the bottom edges.

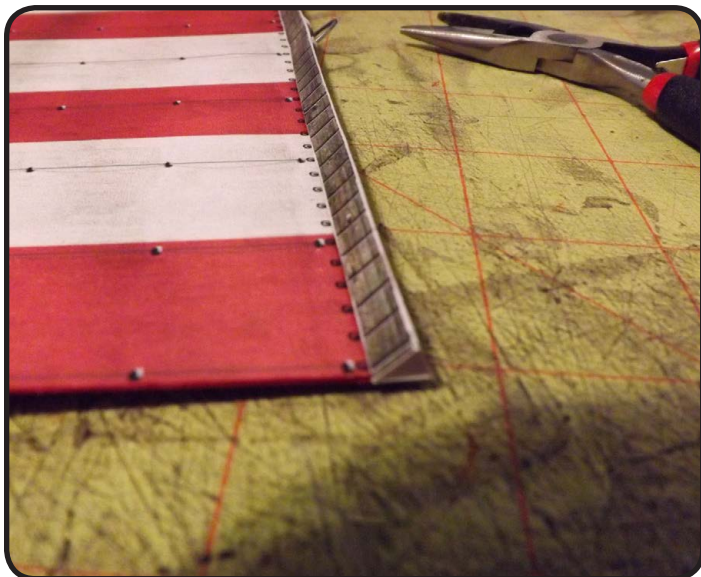


23: Straighten out a paper clip, then wrap in half-way around a pencil (forming a 'U' shape) and insert through the two small holes on the cross beam for the sail. Leave the pencil between the paperclip and the beam to maintain its necessary gap.

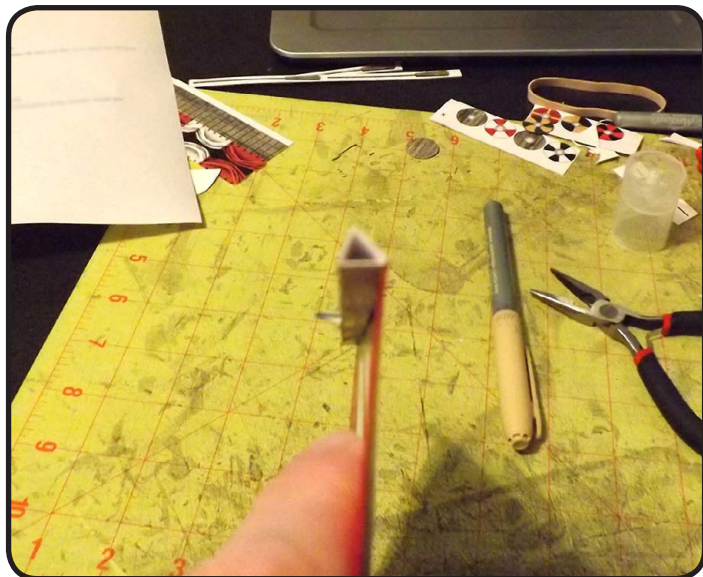


24: On the opposite side, use needle nose pliers to bend the paperclip edges back over as shown (leave the pencil in place while doing this to maintain the paperclip 'U' shape on the outside).

25: Finish by folding and gluing the cross beam into a triangular shape.



26: Fold over towards the back, so the edge with the paperclip is parallel to the sail. Use the paperclip 'U' to slide over the top of the mast.

27: The finished ship with mast glued in place, shields glued along the sides, and oars cut out. Please note: scissors are the easiest way to accurately cut out the shields.
